CALL TO ORDER

Chairperson Arlen Taliaferro called the Citizens Police Advisory Committee meeting to order at 6:03 P.M.

INVOCATION

Secretary Dr. Dana Williamson delivered the Invocation.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chairperson Arlen Taliaferro led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

There were no Public Comments.

AGENDA ITEMS

1. Discuss and take action on previous meeting minutes from April 7, 2025.

Meeting minutes were distributed and reviewed by the group. LaKeisha Ayers-Pruitt made a motion to accept the minutes. Dr. Dana Williamson seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following vote:

Vote 5-0 Ayes – Taliaferro, Slaughter, Williamson, Ayers-Pruitt, Neugent

2. Discuss and review the CPAC by-laws. Arlen Taliaferro, Chairperson

Taliaferro distributed a memo that contained the CPAC by-laws for review and recommendation (copy attached hereto). The by-laws contained in the memo were discussed.

3. Discuss ideas to make CPAC more impactful. Dr. Glyn Horn, Chief of Police

Chief Horn and CPAC members discussed ways that the CPAC can be more impactful in the city. The following ideas were discussed:

- Horn said that a relationship between the CPAC and city homeowner's associations would create good bonds between these groups and would help strengthen city-community relations.
- Ayers-Pruitt agreed that this is a good idea, adding that this would allow CPAC to be more visible in the community.
- CPAC would like to obtain data on city homeowner's associations including contact persons that they could reach out to. The group inquired if a survey could be used to collect this data.
- CPAC expressed interest in attending city-wide events and setting up a booth to be able to meet and interact with the community.

Additional comments were made during this agenda item, as follows:

- Taliaferro stated that she wants to ensure that the CPAC information is visible on the city web site.
- A group picture of the current CPAC will be taken. Tentative dates of Monday, July 21 and Monday, July 28 at 5:00 PM were given to take the pictures.
- CPAC asked if the position that was held by Matthew Chaffin will be refilled or will he continue with the committee.
- Some CPAC members have expired terms. The question was asked where do we stand on allowing members to continue serving past their expired term. Taliaferro said that the Mayor had addressed this and may have some insight.
- CPAC questioned who would scribe notes for the minutes in their group. Ayers-Pruitt said that she could not.
- Neugent requested that CPAC receive direction from council who appointed them as to what the vision and expectations are from them. Some members feel like they are "spinning their wheels".
- Horn said he would ask CPAC what their vision is for their relationship with the Police Department and suggested that CPAC lead the way to make this a meaningful partnership.

- Slaughter says that this group was created during a time when police-community relations were tense. He says that in our city, there are very few major issues where CPAC would be useful.
- Horn said that he would like to see the CPAC meetings move to a more hands on approach where members would spend more time with the Department in the field. Ride alongs, community meetings, interactions and after-action reviews were given as examples of better ways to engage CPAC time. Members agreed and liked the idea that every other CPAC meeting consists of hands-on involvement outside of the building. Taliaferro said this would be a good way to keep a close-knit feel and partner with the Department.
- CPAC would like to revisit members having city e-mail accounts where they can receive messages and interact with community members.
- Taliaferro said that she would like to receive some training on how to speak with citizen's who may have a concern or are upset with the Department and are seeking guidance on how to file a complaint.

ADJOURNMENT

Vice-Chairperson Cartney Slaughter made a motion to adjourn. Committee Member Shaleese Neugent made the second. The motion carried with the following vote:
