The following items were requested to be added:

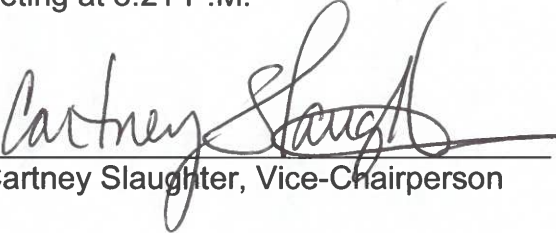
