David Hall, City Manager, completed a presentation regarding 2022-2023 Y.T.D. Internal Police Department Complaint statistics.

Mr. Hall and Deputy Chief Bristow answered the Committee's questions related to external complaints, officer resignations during or following a complaint, resident reimbursement if property is damaged by an officer, progressive discipline, appeals, and rudeness allegations.

4. Discuss next meeting agenda items.

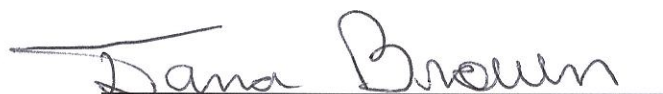
Chairperson Arlen Taliaferro introduced this item. No items were added.
